Marshall is the CEO of a management consulting firm advising government, private, and nonprofit institutions on financial oversight, risk management, and strategic growth. A passionate supporter of the Philharmonic, Marshall previously served on the Associate Board and has been an advocate for the orchestra's mission. His board service includes leadership roles at TC Squared Theater and The Theater Offensive in Boston, where he championed cultural narratives and expanded access to the arts.

Marshall joins the Board of Directors as the Philharmonic prepares for its landmark October 18 performance of *An African American Requiem* and the world premiere of *Invictus* (<u>learn more here</u>), continuing its season of ambitious programming and community partnerships.

As Executive Director, Crain's Business 40 Under 40 awardee and APAP "Spark of Change" winner Terell Johnson has led the orchestra as a force for inclusion with a series of increasingly high-profile events, including the 2024 Lollapalooza debut as the first professional orchestra to perform at the festival to a global audience of 100,000+ live and on Hulu.

Our audiences are 200,000+ strong, and our community engagement programs reach 6,000 students and participants annually. The Chicago Philharmonic proudly collaborates with the greatest artists of our time, in every genre.
